- 2. List **bibliography** card identification letter
- 3. Place ONE main idea/quotation on a card.
- 4. Leave the bottom line open for categorizing information.
- 5. List the page number(s) where information was found.

PARAPHRASE NOTE

Summarize:

Summarize (in your own words) as you take notes unless there is food reason to retrace the thinking of a source. When you summarize, you narrow or reduce what you have read to a few important points.

Paraphrase:

Paraphrasing is restating in your own words what you have read. It is a helpful note-taking technique when you are trying to retrace the thinking of one or your sources directly.

DIRECT QUOTE

Direct Quote:

Use a source's exact word when they include essential information, when the source's language is unique or distinctive, and when the source is considered an expert on the subject. Put this information in guotation marks.
